**Building Bridges, Opening Doors,
and Facilitating Opportunities
in a new Global Legal Environment.**





The world is more globalized than ever today. And the legal profession is no exception. Legal practitioners in fields as diverse as torts and commercial law are engaging clients, firms, and governments abroad as part of the movement toward multi-jurisdictional practice. As these practitioners interact more frequently with clients and firms in the United States, they face uncertainty in the legal language, concepts, and practice of U.S. law. Many non-U.S. firms send their new associates to the United States to study to overcome this knowledge gap, losing the valuable time and services of that associate for extended periods of time.

The Global Legal Education Institute (GLEI) was founded to develop practical and concise courses that provide the most essential U.S. legal training, and to deliver these courses on location. The result is a series of highly-effective seminars that provide key practice tools without interrupting your existing practice. GLEI uses only licensed U.S. practitioners to deliver these intensive courses so that you learn the most relevant and useful skills in the field.

How does it work? GLEI can deliver single courses or a series of courses as part of your staff development plan. Courses can be taught to small or large (up to 20) participants for the same cost. Participants will receive original materials, an intensive seminar from an expert practitioner, and a certificate of completion from GLEI. Your office provides the conference space, refreshments, and audio/visual equipment. GLEI arranges for travel accommodations for our faculty.

All GLEI courses can be taught over one, two or three days, and can be scheduled on weekends or in the evening. They can also be combined with other GLEI courses or customized seminars. Currently, these are the courses GLEI has immediately available:

Legal English for the New Global Legal Practitioner (15 hours).

This course is ideal for legal professionals with a need to understand the institutional structure of the U.S. legal system; common law case analysis; and contract law. The course is interactive and develops legal terminology, writing, and speaking skills. This course combines the U.S. Legal Institutions and U.S. Contract Law courses.

Doing Business in and with the United States (15 hours).

This course is taught jointly with the GLEI business and law faculty. The first half of the course examines the process of U.S. business practice, including idea development, marketing, financing, and globalizing a firm. The second half examines the legal procedures necessary to form and operate a business, joint venture, or other investment in the United States. Key legal and business terminology will be emphasized in this course.

U.S. Legal Institutions and Legal Analysis (8 hours).

This course examines the structures of the U.S. legal and political systems, paying special attention to the court structures at the state and federal levels. The second-half of the course addresses legal analysis in the common law system using precedent, statutes, and regulations.

U.S. Contract Law (6 hours).

This course provides a thorough review of common law contract law, which in the United States is largely based on caselaw analysis. It covers everything from the initial

offer to the suit for breach of contract. It is a case-intensive course.

Advanced Legal Research and Writing (8 hours).

This advanced course takes participants from the foundations of finding appropriate caselaw and structuring a legal brief to drafting for audience impact and writing in Plain Legal English. The course will also cover citation and the use of private and public legal research databases.

U.S. and International Commercial Law (8 hours).

This advanced course provides detailed background on the U.S. economic and legal foundations of commerce, from the Commerce Clause to the Trade Act. It also covers the foundations of the world trade system by examining the GATT, the World Trade Organization, and relevant rules of trade.

U.S. Immigration Law and Practice (6 hours).

This advanced course provides an overview of U.S. immigration law and policy historically and places it in the context of trade, politics, and globalization. The remainder of the course looks at current U.S. immigration law, including the Immigration and Nationality Act, the Homeland Security Act, and other relevant laws and regulations.
